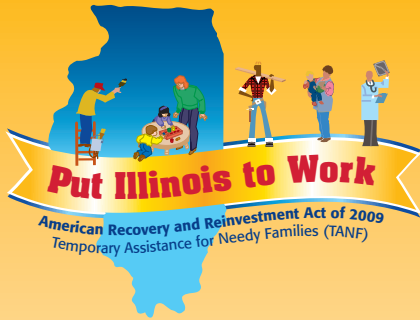




Put Illinois to Work



Job Opportunities for Low-Income Parents and Young Adults!

To participate in *Put Illinois to Work*, you must:

- Be a parent of a minor child
or
- Be a noncustodial parent of a minor child
or
- Be 18-21 years old

In addition:

- Your household income must be below 200 percent of the Federal Poverty Level and
- You must be a U.S. citizen or authorized to work in the U.S.

Put Illinois to Work is a program created by Illinois Governor Pat Quinn and the Illinois Department of Human Services. This program, utilizing state funds and federal stimulus dollars, will be administered in partnership with Heartland Human Care Services, Inc® (HHCS) and the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity to provide temporary positions for eligible unemployed low-income parents and young adults for up to six months, ending September 30, 2010.

Benefits offered by *Put Illinois to Work* include:

- Full-time work paying \$10 per hour
- Connections with employers looking for skilled workers
- Additional career experience and job skills
